

1894 House Overview:

- * Built in 1894 with updates in 1909; architect unknown
- In Dorchester's Ashmont Hill neighborhood—a pending
 Boston Landmark District since 1978!
- * 3,325sf house on a 5,000sf lot = early infill development
- * Very well preserved, but tired when purchased in 2006
- Highlighted projects: total rewiring; restoration of 47 windows; exterior carpentry & porches; kitchens & baths

























































c.1785 House Overview:

- * Built c.1785 in Federal style with later Greek Revival updates
- * In Sandisfield, southeasternmost town in Berkshire County
- * 2,600sf house on a 26.5 acre parcel (orig. 75acres+)
- Very well preserved, but many condition issues when purchased in 2018.
- Highlighted projects: re-roofing & chimney rebuilding;
 rebuilding of kitchen ell & "tavern" wing; interior features.



























































1953 House Overview:

- * Main camp built by Grandpa Tigh in 1953; 1960s bunkhouse
- * On Lake Tashmoo, outside of Vineyard Haven, MV
- * 400sf+/- camp on under 2 acres
- Value of the "architecture" is sentimental; value of view & family connections is priceless
- Highlighted projects: decluttering; basic repairs; new septic system; family dynamics & the survival of modest MV camps.









Wrap Up & Take-aways

- * Live with a place for awhile before you change it...if you can...
- You might need an architect or design profession to help articulate your vision and needs.
- If you are handy, know what you can do yourself, and when to hire a professional.
- Make sure you find a contractor who is the right fit for you and for what the building/project needs.

Wrap Up & Take-aways

- * Think for the long-term, whenever possible...do things well, and do them right--and hopefully only once! (Sometimes this means spending more \$ up-front than you might want to...)
- Don't take advice only from Home Depot...use preservation-friendly resources whenever possible for advice, guidance, and sourcing products.
- Make sure you understand the historic status of your building and what requirements you might need to follow.
- Take advantage of resources (advice and perhaps financial) of your local gov't and historical commission.
